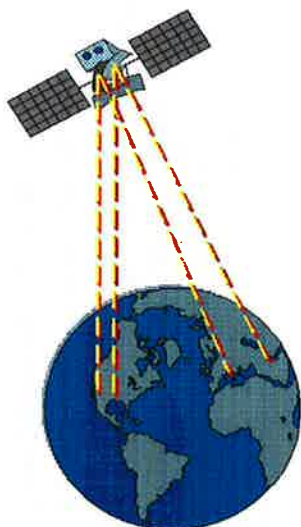


Would you like to know how to?
