<u><b>New Transfer Students</b></u>	<u><b>Current MSU Students</b></u>
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Apply for admission to MSU online now – <a href="http://www.msstate.edu">www.msstate.edu</a> link to Prospective Students. Select “Distance Education” as the MSU campus for the full Summer Term.</li> <li>2. Submit official transcripts to <b>MSU Admissions</b> by <b>March 18</b>. You are submitting a partial transcript (first set) at this time; you will need to submit another transcript (second) at the end of the Spring semester to <b>MSU Admissions</b> to complete your file. You will be placed on hold if you fail to send a second set and you will not be able to pre-register in October for Spring.</li> <li>3. Submit a Summer Field application and medical form to <b>CFR Academic Affairs</b> by <b>March 18</b>.</li> <li>4. Submit your immunization records to the <b>MSU Health Center</b> before <b>March 18</b>. Confirm your health record is clear.</li> <li>5. After you have been given a “clear” or an “admit contingent” status by <b>MSU Admissions</b> <u>AND</u> have completed Items 3 and 4 above, you may email Ms. Rachel for an appt on <b>April 18</b> to pre-register. Her email is <a href="mailto:rsingleton@cfr.msstate.edu">rsingleton@cfr.msstate.edu</a>. This will be the <b>only day</b> to pre-register for Summer Camp. Students will secure a Fall schedule at this time.</li> <li>6. <u><b>ALL</b></u> Holds must be taken care of before you can pre-register for the Summer Field Program. Check your own Banner Account under the Holds link to confirm that you are clear.</li> <li>7. When you visit campus to pre-register, you will have an opportunity to secure a car decal and your MSU ID card. The card will give you after hours access to Thompson Hall. Bring your car tag number with you for the car decal. This decal is for summer, another decal is required for Fall.</li> <li>8. If you are taking a pre-requisite for Summer Camp this spring, have your community college teacher send this email to Ms. Rachel by <b>May 9</b>: “_____ will successfully pass _____ class.” The email must be sent by the instructor of the course to <a href="mailto:rsingleton@cfr.msstate.edu">rsingleton@cfr.msstate.edu</a></li> <li>9. At the end of May, submit a second official transcript identifying your final Spring grades to the MSU Admissions or your account will be put on hold.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Pre-register for the classes you plan to take during the Summer Field Program before <b>April 18</b>.
