DESCRIPTION

This program addresses cottonwood plantation management for the production of carbon and biomass markets as well as for long-term ecosystem restoration in the Delta.

Mr. Steve Burgess will (1) discuss an innovative tree planting concept in cottonwood silviculture as it pertains to capturing the most revenue for the landowner, (2) provide current carbon market information, and (3) discuss cost share opportunities for cottonwood establishment.

Mr. Burgess is a native of the Mississippi Delta and recently retired after working for 25 years with the Mississippi Forestry Commission. He is currently the state manager for GreenTrees, a forest restoration and carbon sequestration program created for landowners within the seven states of the Lower Mississippi Alluvial Valley.


