- ◆ Many landowners are concerned that their land will not receive adequate care due to the lack of interest from the younger generation
- ◆ Some current landowners have concerns with handing land over to family members with substance abuse or other problems
- ◆ Some landowners face the inability or unwillingness to deal with the reality that their land will someday be owned by the next generation
- ◆ 40% of forest landowners don't have a written will or other estate planning preparations
- ◆ Many landowners lack the tools to make important decisions and to create a logical successional plan
