

2021 Summer Field Program General Information

The Summer Field Program (SFP) consists of four courses for a total of nine hours of credit. This summer there will be one program for upcoming juniors and one program for upcoming seniors. All incoming transfer students will register for the junior session. The SFP courses will conflict with all other MSU summer sessions. Students will not be able to register for other MSU courses in the summer.

Summer Field Program Courses with prerequisites

FO 3012 Introduction to Forest Communities (*Prerequisites: Dendrology and Soils*)
 FO 3015 Forest Description and Analysis (*Prerequisites: Forest Measurements, Intro Statistics*)
 FO 4231 Forest Operations and Harvesting Lab (*Co-Requisite: FO 3015 For Desc & Analysis*)
 WFA 3031 Wildlife and Fisheries Practices (*No pre-requisites*)

You may not enroll in a course for which the prerequisites have not been completed with a passing grade. A grade of “F” or “Audit” will not satisfy a prerequisite.

Transfer students

Transfer students currently enrolled in prerequisites must submit a copy of final grades to Lanna Miller (LCM1@msstate.edu) before **May 24**. Transfer students must also send final transcripts (after spring semester grades are posted) to MSU Admissions or student records will be placed on hold. Admission to MSU and registration for the Summer Field Program must be finalized to participate in first day activities.

Tuition/Fees

Regular tuition and fees are required for the nine hours of credit of the SFP.

Students are encouraged to submit the FAFSA even if they will not be receiving financial aid since the FAFSA information is also used to award scholarships.

Scholarships: SFP students are eligible for scholarships which will be awarded after the completion of SFP 2021. Students must complete the MSU general and conditional scholarship applications to be eligible. Students who complete their applications by the March 1 deadline will be considered for MSU, CFR and SFP scholarships. The MSU application is found under the Student Financial Aid and Scholarships tab in the MyState portal.
